

GIPP'S UNDERSTANDABLE HISTORY OF THE BIBLE

THE NEW SCOFIELD REFERENCE BIBLE

WHAT ABOUT THE NEW SCOFIELD VERSION?

The New Scofield Reference Bible is unfortunately a **double lie**. In fact, this deceitful version lies to its readers **twice** on the title page. On that page it claims to be an “Authorized King James Version.” Yet on almost every page a King James word has been removed from the text and placed in the margin preceded by “KJV.” This happens **on the average** of three times per page! No one can make three changes per page and **pretend** that he is printing a King James Bible!

The title page also claims to be a “Scofield” Reference Bible. This is also a lie. Why? Because in the footnote found under 1 Corinthians 11:23, the “**New Scofield Version**” states that the Lord’s supper is a “**sacrament**.” The standard teaching of the Roman Catholic Church is that a “sacrament” is something that “bestows saving grace.” Yet when you check the same verse in the **old Scofield** reference Bible...**there is no such note!** This is a **Roman Catholic** note, not a **Scofield** note.

Again, in Acts 8:12 there is another footnote that claims that baptism is a “sacrament.” Again the closet Roman Catholics on the **New Scofield** board of editors have spoken. Yet when you check the **old Scofield** for a footnote in Acts 8:12, you find that **there is no note**. This is a **Roman Catholic** note, not a **Scofield** note.

Yet the worse is yet to come! In the footnote found under 1 Chronicles 11:11 the reader will find this, “God gave us a Bible free from error **in the original manuscripts**. In its preservation through many generations of recopying, He providentially kept it from **serious error**, although **He permitted a few scribal mistakes**.” (Emphasis Dr. Gipp’s) Here we have the **New Scofield** board of editors claiming not only that the Bible has mistakes in it but that **God put them there!** Check the **old Scofield**. No such note exists. It is not a Scofield note and the **New Scofield Reference Version is not** a Scofield Bible.

Most people that get a New Scofield Version are tricked into it. They either buy one because they **think** that it a King James Bible or some loved one buys it for them because they **think** that they’re buying a King James Bible.

Thus we see that the New Scofield Reference Version lies to you **twice** before you get past the title page. Now if it lies to you twice on the title page what do you think it is going to do in its text?
